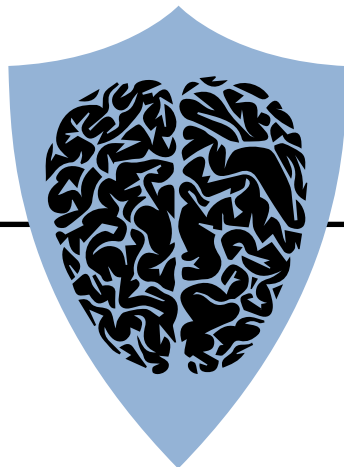

FRESHMAN YEAR

Freshman year is the time to start thinking about the medical school. The planning process begins as early as fall of your freshman year. This is the time to strategically plan out the sequence of your coursework, summers and extra-curricular activities, leadership and volunteer work to ensure you are able to complete all of the requirements to apply in spring of your junior year. SOPHOMORE YEAR

Sophomore year is a time to **continue strategizing** and planning coursework to ensure you have completed everything you need to be prepared for the MCAT and meet medical school admission requirements. JUNIOR YEAR

Fall/Winter of Junior year is when the medical school admissions planning begins. For many applicants they will need to start thinking about scheduling the MCAT in January of their junior year for the early Spring dates. This allows an option to repeat it in early summer if necessary. This is a time to familiarize yourself with different medical schools and their requirements and start thinking about where you might want to apply. It is time to start approaching mentors and faculty to make sure you get the best letters of recommendation. This is the time to decide if you are going to do a gap year. Decision making is in full gear and application season is here. Get a head start. InGenius Prep has several application building packages that will suit your needs.

Winter/Early spring of Junior year is when the admissions cycle formally begins. Many of you will be registering and studying for the MCAT examination. It is never too early to start working on a draft of your personal statement. AMCAS is open early-May but there is one month before you can formally submit your application in early-June. The first date AMCAS data is transmitted to medical schools is June 27th. You need your transcripts forwarded to AMCAS prior to submission to medical schools, however, you do not have to have your

MCAT scores or letters of recommendation completed. These will be forwarded to schools when they are available on a rolling basis. You can find school deadlines within the AMCAS application. Summer of junior year is when the heavy lifting begins. Early decision applications are due on August 1st with a decision by October 1st. Regular admission deadlines start in October and end in December with decisions by March. You should have your AMCAS application complete and the secondary applications starting to arrive. You should be sure you have all of your letters of recommendation completed. If you haven't taken the MCAT yet or are repeating it now is the time register and take it in late summer. Fall of senior year you will continue on the interview trail with campus visits at medical schools. Need to brush up on your interview skills, it is not too late.
